

REQUEST FOR LETTERS OF INTENT FOR IDENTIFIED NEEDS

Regional Center of the East Bay has an identified need for services for people with developmental disabilities. We are requesting Letters of Intent for these programs which are listed below.

Please note that you are expected to be able to serve consumers from all ethnic backgrounds and be able to support the individual in his or her primary language. A statement related to this will be needed in the program design

We will be prioritizing the vendorization of programs that meet the current needs of the consumers being served by RCEB. Vendorizations of programs that do not match our needs listed below may be considered at a later date.

All residential programs listed below should have a maximum of six beds. However, preference is for 4 single rooms. Also, unless specifically identified as a requirement, there is a preference that all residential facilities be able to serve at least some consumers who are non-ambulatory, including those that use wheelchairs.

- A group home for children with Autism. The home must offer sensory integration, structured daily routines, PECS, etc. Level 4I.
- A group home for children in Southern Alameda County (Fremont, Hayward, San Leandro, San Lorenzo). Level 4I.
- A group home for female children only- Level 4I.
- A group home for children who are non-ambulatory (including use of a wheelchair)
- A group home for children located in the Tri-Valley area. Level 4I
- A group home for children located in Western Contra Costa County- Level 4I.
- A group home for children located in Eastern Contra Costa County- Level 4H
- An adult residential facility for dually diagnosed consumers. The home must offer a therapeutic environment. Level 4
- An adult residential facility to address medical issues such as seizures and dementia- like characteristics. Level 4C at least two non-ambulatory beds (wheelchairs)
- An adult residential facility for transition age young adults, 18-22. All female or all male. Level 3.
- An adult residential facility able to serve consumers who are monolingual in Spanish. Level 3.
- An adult residential facility able to serve consumers who are monolingual in American Sign Language. Level 3.
- An adult residential facility able to support consumers involved in the criminal justice system. Level 4.
- An adult residential facility able to support consumers with substance abuse challenges. Level 4.
- An adult residential facility in Western Contra Costa County, Level 4A -at least two non-ambulatory beds. (wheelchair)
- An adult residential facility in Western Contra Costa County, Level 2
- An adult residential facility in Western Contra Costa County, Level 3
- An adult residential facility located in Eastern Contra Costa County able to serve consumers who are non-ambulatory (including use of a wheelchair)

- An adult residential facility able to serve consumers who are deaf/hearing impaired or deaf/blind. Level 3
- An adult residential facility able to serve consumers who are blind/vision impaired. Level 3
- A residential care facility-elderly to address moderate behavioral challenges, Level 4F -at least two non-ambulatory beds (wheelchairs)
- An adult residential facility able to serve consumers who are mothers during the times that they are pregnant up to the point when the child reaches 3 years of age. (Level 4A-C)
- A day program that is not site based with a goal of promoting job attainment. (should have ability to serve consumers who are non-ambulatory, including those that use wheelchairs).

This list is subject to change as potential vendors are identified to meet the needs and/or new needs arise.

We will be accepting Letters of Intent regarding these programs until December 31, 2012. If you are unable to submit by this date, please be aware that RCEB will be updating the needed program list in the spring 2013 and will accept related Letters of Intent at that time.
