The AFIRM modules that have been created by CAPTAIN. Our hope is to promote these modules within our homes and day programs. The modules are all based on evidence-based practices like prompting, reinforcement, self-management, task analysis, etc. Each module is about 1.5 - 2 hours long, has a pre- and post-test, and you can choose to earn a certificate for passing the module.

Providing Mental Health Care support in CCF

Thursday, September 14, 2023, 10 am – 1 pm, Virtually*

The purpose of this training is to help attendees gain basic knowledge of mental health disorders that are often diagnosed in adults with intellectual/developmental disabilities residing in community care facilities. This webinar will cover core symptoms of those disorders and how it may present as challenging behaviors or deficit skills. Attendees will receive practical examples of how mental health challenges translate into common objectives (i.e. selfhelp, independent living, social, communication, and community) and considerations to take when providing support. 3 hours ARM credits. New! Behavior Plan Basics

What is a behavior plan really, and why do we use them? New! Trauma Informed Care in Residential Care Facilities Thursday, October 5, 2023, 10am – 1pm, Virtually*

This course focuses on providing support and training for delivering person-centered care (PCC) and trauma-informed care (TIC) at community care facilities. Various forms of trauma will be discussed alongside consequences and its manifestation as treatment barriers for both consumers and care-providers. Training on values and principles of PCC and TIC will be integrated into a streamlined form of service delivery. Attendees will receive information and specific examples on implementing integrative care while understanding how personal experiences and trauma may also be present. This presentation will also include strategies on collaboration with consumers and the interdisciplinary team to ensure PCC and TIC. 3 hours ARM credits. New! Prompting for Adult Service Providers

Prompting is an evidence-based practice that increases the success of target skills or desired behaviors. Prompting can be helpful for learners of all ages and across different settings. This training is especially aimed at adult service providers who support adult clients. Service providers for all ages are also welcome.

PCT Trainings

Dates: 12/5, 12/6, 12/7, 12/12, 12/13, 12/14 - All trainings will be held from 10AM-1PM Virtually*

Person-Centered Thinking revolves around the core principle of balancing What's Important To someone and What's Important For someone. Through this training, attendees will learn practical skills that they can take back to their respective workplaces that center the person being supported, while continuing to effectively improve the supports that are currently in place.

NOTE: As this training has been moved to a virtual space, attendees can expect to invest about 18 hours of training delivered via Zoom. Each training series will consist of 6 dates and times and attendees are expected to attend ALL parts of the series to receive their credit. Moreover, we are also requesting **one person per computer screen with a** webcam and microphone, as you are able, since this is a highly interactive training with breakout groups throughout the training. Finally, more training series will be released as we continually assess the impact of COVID-19 on PCT training offerings.

New! Using visual Supports to Improve Communication and Well-Being Thursday, December 7, 2023, 10am – 1pm, virtually

Visual supports are an evidence-based practice that uses visual tools to support an individual as they move through the day. This training will focus on different types of visual supports that can improve a person's well-being and quality of life. This training is particularly aimed at adult service providers. Service providers for all ages are also welcome as visual supports can be used to help individuals of all ages and across different settings.
