A <u>"Generic Resource"</u> is any agency that has the legal obligation to serve all members of the general public and is receiving public funds for providing those services. Generic Resources that support your goals may not be supplanted by Regional Center of East Bay and must be exhausted before utilizing Self Determination Program dollars.
